\$3,000 project grants available

Submission deadline: May 1, 2010

Share your best teaching practices or research a subject of interest to the teaching profession.

In June each year, the ATA Educational Trust awards a number of grants of up to \$3,000 to help Alberta teachers (or others involved in education and teaching) to develop innovative, made-in-Alberta education resources in any area of the curriculum or about any current educational concern. Submissions in the area of special education, global and environmental education, and Francophone, Aboriginal and early childhood education are of particular interest to the Trust. Any individual or group planning to undertake such a project during the next school year is eligible to apply. Projects must be planned for the 2010/11 school year.

Grants will be payable against receipts for expenses. Resources produced become part of the holdings of the ATA Library and teachers are encouraged to share their work at teachers' conventions and conferences.

CONDITIONS:

Applicants must submit a detailed proposal, on or before May 1, 2010. Incomplete proposals will *not* be considered. Project summaries *must* include

1. a cover page with the name of the project;
2. the name, address, home phone number and e-mail address of the applicant(s);
3. the name, address, phone and fax number of the school, institution or workplace;
4. the name of the applicant's ATA local, if applicable;
5. a detailed description of the project that explains the objective(s) and highlights what the project will achieve and how it will benefit teachers and students in Alberta;
6. a logical plan that details how the project will be carried out and explains who will do what, when, where and why;
7. a description of the resource or final report that will be produced upon completion;
8. a detailed list of anticipated expenses, including other possible sources of revenue with explanatory notes—the board reimburses only expenses deemed appropriate;
9. background documents that support or clarify the proposal; and
10. a letter of support from a direct supervisor.

Applicants should send *three* signed and dated copies of their proposal, *on or before the deadline*, to the ATA Educational Trust (11010 142 Street NW, Edmonton AB T5N 2R1). Faxed or e-mailed applications will *not* be accepted. Incomplete proposals will not be considered.
