# **Educator E-Exchange Programs**

An Alberta Education program administered by the Alberta Teachers' Association

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Short-term exchange applications continue to be accepted. Participants must accept that a match may be cancelled at the last minute due to unforeseen circumstances. In the event of cancellation, EEP cannot guarantee another exchange placement. Educator Exchange Programs continue to follow the guidance of our federal and provincial governments in conjunction with relevant authorities and our partner organizations.

# **Short-Term E-Exchange Application**

#### **Eligibility Criteria**

- 1. All applicants must
  - hold a valid Alberta teacher's certificate;
  - be a member in good standing of the Alberta Teachers' Association;
  - be a Canadian citizen;
  - have completed a minimum of five years of teaching (this can vary—check with your district for its specific requirements);
  - have a continuing teaching contract;
  - be in excellent mental and physical health;
  - show evidence of flexibility, mature judgment and a strong willingness to undertake challenges;

#### How does it work

- The exchange is a reciprocal arrangement. An Alberta teacher or school leader is matched with another teacher or school leader in a similar field/interest area.
- Matching would focus on the particular topic or project of interest.
- The length of match can vary between 3–8 weeks, depending on the scope and proposal of the project.
- Official school twinning will be offered with Alberta Education and the host school.
- You and your exchange partner engage in discussions and video chats outside of class hours, much like a virtual pen pal, around educational topics. The frequency you connect is up to you. We recommend at minimum a couple of times per week during the exchange period.

### **Placement Opportunities**

- E-exchanges can be arranged with the province, within Canada, and with our international partners.
- Please contact the EEP exchange coordinator to complete an expression of interest.





# Recommended Time Frames for Applications for a Short-term Exchange

**Before you apply**—approach your school leader and district to see if they will support your application for an exchange. The application will take a few days to complete in a thorough manner. Remember that this application will create a lasting impression with your potential exchange teacher, host school and host district.

**Before you apply**—talk with your partner, family and friends about undertaking an exchange. Read some teacher exchange blogs or watch the ATA YouTube videos posted on the ATA website and other resources.

**Gather information**—an exchange is a serious commitment that should not be taken lightly. Your district may be able to provide you with names of colleagues who have previously completed an exchange.

Fill in your application, providing as much detail as possible. Remember, this is your first impression for the overseas district considering your application. Your letter of introduction is your chance to showcase your school, area and province. Gather the necessary signature pages from your school leader and district.

#### **Application Deadlines**

Because our short-term exchanges take place during various times of the year, there is no formal deadline for submitting applications. Bear in mind that because school systems are not the same in each area, we will focus on different areas at various times of the year.

If you are a **teacher**, all applications must have your school leader and district approval. If you are a **school leader**, all applications must have district approval. It is the responsibility of the **applicant** to EMAIL the application to exchanges@ata.ab.ca.

#### **Selection and Matching**

Once an applicant's entire application has been received by the EEP office, the teacher exchange coordinator will hold an interview to review the candidate's file and determine suitability. Once the applicant is admitted to the EEP program, the coordinator will work with our partner organizations to propose matches. Matches are based first upon similar teaching and/or school leader assignments. This process takes place over a period of months.

## **Approval in Alberta**

If you are a teacher, the visitor application is forwarded to the Alberta teacher applicant for consideration and must have school leader approval.

If you are a school leader, the visitor application is forwarded to the Alberta school leader applicant for consideration and must have district approval.

## **Approval Abroad**

The same opportunity is given to the district, school leader and proposed exchange partner. **Therefore, an exchange is not considered to be final until all parties have agreed to the match.** Applicants will be notified when their exchange has been finalized on all sides. This process can take approximately one month or longer. Shortly thereafter, Alberta teachers/school leaders will receive materials outlining the next steps in preparing for the exchange.

#### **Virtual Orientation Meeting**

Once you are matched with your exchange partner, you will receive an invitation via e-mail detailing the **mandatory** orientation. This session will provide information related to health care, cultural adaptation, intercultural competencies and the education system in the host country. **Please have your orientation materials that were e-mailed to you at this meeting.** 

#### **Application Costs**

As this program is a provincially managed government program, there are currently no application fees.

#### Commitment

- 1. The commitment to the Educator Exchange Programs (EEP) is considerable. By applying, you are committed to follow through with your application. Withdrawals that occur in the middle of the exchange application process inconvenience many levels of cooperation between countries, host organizations, districts, schools and individual participants. It may not be the best time to apply if you are contemplating a career move or experiencing health issues, marital issues, family illness, etc.
- 2. Applicants must accept that a match may be cancelled at the last minute due to unforeseen circumstances. In the event of cancellation, EEP cannot guarantee another exchange placement.


