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# Leading for Learning: The Interim Report of the Blue Ribbon Panel on the School Administrator

At its September meeting, Provincial Executive Council (PEC) established a Blue Ribbon Panel on the School Administrator to review Association services and structures. The panel, whose members are primarily school administrators from across Alberta, functioned at arm's length from PEC and retained Dr Charles Hyman for research support.

The Panel presented its interim report at an emergent PEC meeting on 2005 02 12. Council authorized wide distribution of this report to give all members the opportunity to read and respond to the recommendations presented in the report. We expect that schools will receive a copy of the report, the executive summary and the response guide during the week of 2005 02 22. As well, the

executive summary and the response guide will be available on the Association website (www.teachers.ab.ca).

It is important that all members have the opportunity to comment on the recommendations. The questions to you from the Panel are these: "Have we got it right? Is this how best to meet administrator needs?" All members are strongly encouraged to read the recommendations and provide responses by mail, fax or e-mail prior to 2005 03 16.

Once the panel has your responses it will reconvene, still working at arm's length from Provincial Executive Council, and consider your feedback. After this review, the Panel will send its final recommendations to Council, and Council will take action on the recommendations.
