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Field Review of Draft Principal Quality Practice Standard

Alberta Education is inviting principals to review and provide feedback on the *Principal Quality Practice Standard: Successful School Leadership in Alberta*, which was recently mailed to all school principals. The draft Principal Quality Practice Standard was developed by Alberta Education and a Stakeholder Advisory Committee to address Alberta's Commission on Learning Recommendation 76. A copy of the draft document and response form is available on the ATA website under Resources for Administrators (www.teachers.ab.ca).

Principals are encouraged to provide feedback to Alberta Education by July 14, 2006. Alberta Education is also inviting

review and comments from superintendents, school board and school council chairpersons, and stakeholder groups. In addition, the department will organize a number of invitational regional focus group meetings in the fall 2006. The ATA Administrator Issues and Concerns Committee will be providing a written response on behalf of the Association.

The Stakeholder Advisory Committee will reconvene later in the fall to review all the feedback and make the necessary changes to the draft document. Once the revisions are complete the document will be forwarded to the Minister of Education for approval in time for implementation in the 2006/07 school year.
