The committee

The commitment

This committee position is an opportunity to share your voice and represent your colleagues at the provincial level. As a committee member, you would attend the committee's meetings (three in-person meetings in Edmonton and additional virtual meetings as required). You would come prepared to speak to the matters under consideration from your perspective as a local president, as well as your perspective as a teacher or school leader in the field.

The Association covers travel and incidental costs, as well as release time, to enable field members to attend committee meetings.

The candidacy

Members must hold the highest level of membership available to them to serve on a committee. For this committee, the successful candidates will be currently serving as a local president. Additional experience in local communications work is considered an asset. In addition, consideration shall be given to those who have evidenced commitment to the Association through attendance at the Annual Representative Assembly or the Summer Conference, and/or the holding of office in a local, specialist council, bargaining unit or convention association. Candidates for committee positions are selected to serve on the basis of their expertise, their commitment to the Association and, in some cases, their geographic location and area of specialization.

The Association embraces diversity and inclusion and is committed to representing members belonging to equity-seeking groups. Members belonging to equity-seeking groups are encouraged to apply.
